Our Vision

Our camps are committed to creating a community which help campers unlock their potential and discover the world, while developing life skills.

Our Program Philosophy

We believe that everything that happens at camp is program from cleaning the latrines to paddling a canoe.

In our safe and supportive environment girls become active participants in the learning process as counselors guide them in not only having fun but understanding the importance of how and what they are doing.

Why camp is important

We believe camp and childhood go together just as well as peanut butter and jelly. Summer camp is not only tremendously fun but is vitally important. Here are just a few of the reasons camp is so important.

- Camp presents a remarkable opportunity for your camper to widen her horizons, make new and lasting friends, and discover new strengths.
- The true payoff of camp will be apparent when your camper comes home more self-reliant, self-sufficient, and self-confident.
- Camp is a place where girls can “practice” growing up by stretching their social, emotional,



physical and cognitive muscles outside the context of their immediate families.

- Camp creates future leaders. At camp girls get a close-up look at compassionate leadership through the camp staff. And, girls get loads of opportunities to practice being a leader themselves by voicing their feelings, making individual choices, and negotiating group decision making.

General day camp information

Girl Scout Day Camp is a wonderful way to experience all the fun of camp and still return home each evening! With professional leadership and quality staff, camp is a great place for girls to stretch their limits, widen their horizons and experience all the fun of camp. Camper groups are typically made up of 15-18 campers and 2 counselors. Girls are placed in groups by age.



Program Aide

Girl Scout Day Camp at Singing Hills and Girl Scout Day Camp in Juneau offer a Program Aide option for girls entering grades 7-12 in the fall. Girls can sign up for two weeks of Program Aide each summer. Girls must have completed Program Aide training with Girl Scouts of Alaska prior to camp. Contact the council office for training dates.



Bus information

Girl Scout Day Camp at Singing Hills, at Togowoods and in Juneau all offer bus service to and from camp for an additional \$25 fee per week. **Buses are supervised by camp staff.** Buses leave as scheduled. A late fee will be charged to parents/guardians who arrive after the scheduled pick up time.



Make sure to indicate your bus choice on the registration form.

Late fees

Parents/guardians who arrive after the scheduled time to pick up their child at camp or the bus will be charged the following late fees:

First five minutes	\$5.00
Six - ten minutes	\$10.00
Eleven - fifteen minutes	\$15.00
After fifteen minutes	\$20.00

Late fees must be paid at the time they are incurred. Late fees apply to Girl Scout Day Camp at Singing Hills, at Togowoods and in Juneau.

WELCOME TO RESIDENT CAMP!

General resident camp information

At resident camp every day is a chance to do something different, meet new people, and challenge yourself. With professional leadership, high quality staff and small camper groups with high counselor-to-camper ratio, resident camp will feel like a home away from home.

Camper groups are generally made up of 8-12 girls and 2 counselors. Camper groups attend daily activities together. Special care is taken to ensure that each camper is given challenging opportunities along with basic skill-based instruction.



Camp Togowoods

Camp Togowoods is located on over 300 beautiful acres owned by Girl Scouts of Alaska along the shores of Three Mile Lake near Wasilla. It encompasses five ecosystems to explore, including our wetlands boardwalk. All Camp Togowoods campers enjoy: arts and crafts, nature hikes and environmental education, swimming, canoeing or kayaking, outdoor cooking and our 35-foot climbing tower (girls entering grades 4+). Campers sleep in platform tents (wooden floors, cots and mosquito netting) bringing the outdoors within reach. Campers have a sense of independence with the security of counselors living in an adjacent tent.



Camp Kenai Lake (Exclusive registration for Kenai Peninsula residents until April 15, 2011.)

Located at Camp Kushtaka in Cooper Landing, Camp Kenai Lake is the perfect place to swim, canoe, and do arts and crafts. Our experienced

Togowoods staff are coming to

Kenai Lake to work with girls as they explore nature, hike the trails and sing campfire songs. Girls will stay in cabins.



Camp Feather Winds

(Exclusive registration for Southeast residents until April 15, 2011.)

Located at Eagle River Methodist Camp in Juneau, Camp Feather Winds is the perfect way to end the summer. Our experienced, enthusiastic Togowoods staff will be joining Feather Winds campers for a second year as they explore the woods, do arts and craft projects, and more. Older campers have the option of signing up for a program that includes a wilderness trip (see page 10). Girls will stay in cabins. Girls come to camp from across Southeast Alaska.

Feather Winds travel information

For girls outside Juneau, the council will help arrange transportation to and from camp by ferry for an additional \$25 or \$50 fee depending on location (see the registration form for details). **Ferries will be chaperoned by camp staff.** Be sure to mark the registration form if transportation assistance is needed. *Please note we need a full middle name to make ferry registrations – see registration form.*

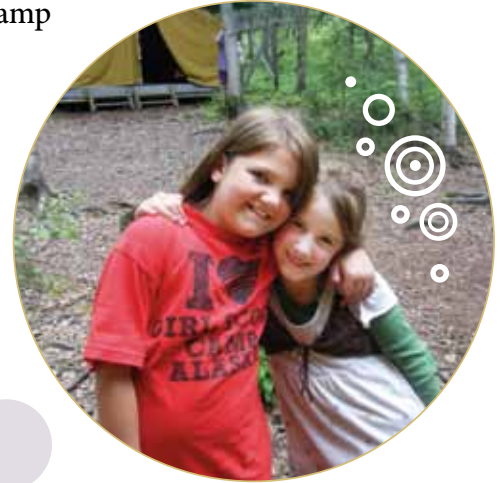

Water Programs

When your camper participates in one of our water program based out of Camp Togowoods she experiences all the fun of our Girl Scout Camp program (page 10) while building paddling skills during daily program blocks at the waterfront. Campers explore our lake and practice their paddling with our Small Craft Safety Certified staff. Togowoods offers canoeing, kayaking and recreational row boating. As girls gain paddling skills they have the opportunity to



participate in progressively challenging adventures. Paddlers Paradise (level 2) campers test their kayaking skills on a ½ day kayak trip on Finger Lake. River Runners (level 3) campers experience the ultimate challenge (and thrill) on a ½ day river raft trip on the Matanuska River with NOVA River Runners.

RESIDENT CAMP – WILDERNESS ADVENTURE PROGRAMS

Wilderness Adventure Programs

Wilderness trips take courage, confidence and character to the limit. In small groups, girls quickly learn to count on each other. You have to paddle or hike together or you don't get there. There is no one to do it but you, and you can do it.

Our trip programs teach girls outdoor skills. More importantly, our wilderness trips lay a solid foundation for leadership, teamwork and self-confidence throughout girls' lives.



All trek groups spend time in remote wilderness areas and at many points on trail, groups will be more than two hours from professional medical care. Staff are trained in emergency back country procedures,

carry satellite phones and at least one staff member is certified in Wilderness First Aid. All programs require a properly fitted backpack, wilderness rated packable sleeping bag, and hiking boots. Campers should be able to carry a 20-30 lb. backpack and, for canoeing treks, share the weight of carrying an 80 lb. canoe for up to a mile over land.



All wilderness campers also experience all the fun of our Girl Scout Camp programs (page 10).

Check out the trip progression chart below to help you and your camper choose the right adventure. Parents and campers self select the right trip level based on skill and grade level. For help, contact Amanda at the Anchorage office.

FINANCES AND REGISTRATION INFORMATION

Finances:

We believe that the benefits of camp are priceless. We also realize that parent's pocketbooks aren't bottomless. So, as you and your camper start dreaming about summer camp (and we hope you are) remember we are here to help make camp possible for every girl and every budget. Cookie credits, camperships and other discounts can be used for all council sponsored camps.



Cookie Credits:

If your camper sold Girl Scout cookies in the 2011 sale, every box she sold gets her one step closer to camp.

- 15¢ per box at day camp or 30¢ per box at resident camp
- 400 boxes equal a free session at day camp (or the 3 day Girl Scout Camp program)
- 600 boxes equal a free session (up to one week in length) at resident camp

For multiple camps, cookie credits will be applied to a girl's registrations in the order those registrations are received. Cookie credits may be claimed one time only. Credits may not be transferred from one girl to another and do not have cash value. Credits from the 2011 cookie program must be used by August 2011. Cookie credits are only good at Girl Scouts of Alaska camps. Families with product sale delinquencies are unable to use cookie credits or apply for camp scholarships until their debt has been paid.

Camperships:

We know camp is an extra... Camperships provide assistance to ANY girl who wishes to attend camp.

- Any girl may apply for one resident camp and one day camp campership each year
- Multiple girls from the same family may apply for camperships
- There must be a need for financial assistance (without assistance your camper would not be able to attend)
- Families are expected to pay the deposit fee (\$30). If families have difficulty paying the deposit, contact the council.



- Campership assistance is awarded up to 90% of the camp fee, depending on family size and income.

Other discounts (sister special)

When more than one girl in the same family attends camp, one girl is eligible for the Sister Special. The sister with the lowest camp fee will receive a 10% discount. This discount is only applicable once during the 2011 season.

If you would like to donate a registration to someone less fortunate, please add any amount to your payment on the online or paper registration form.

Registration Information

Registration opens March 15, 2011.

Register online at www.girlscoutsalaska.org/programs/camps and receive a \$20 discount per camper.

Camper registrations are also accepted by mail, fax or in person at the Anchorage office. No phone registrations will be accepted.

A \$30 non-refundable deposit per program must accompany each registration.

Campers can indicate a friend (buddy) of a similar age/grade they would like to be with at the time they register for camp. Girl Scouts of Alaska does not guarantee buddy placement.

Cancellations and Refunds

If your camper will be unable to attend as planned, refunds of fees (excluding the deposit) are given if:

- Cancellation is made 4 weeks before the session begins
- Camper has moved out of the council area
- Camper has personal illness/injury confirmed by a physician
- Family emergency

If full camp balance is not received by one week prior to the start of camp, your camper will be cancelled from her session.

- **One session of day or resident camp may be funded**, however more than one of your children may apply for a campership.
Note: Your camper may apply for a campership even though she has received one in the past.
- You will receive notification of campership granted and your balance due.
