If this donation request is approved, and the donation will be made by pass through, you must complete the pass through form, found on our website. The donation **must** be made by pass through if it is **over \$250**. This means the check or ACH must be made out to Girl Scouts of Alaska, and then we will do a pass through to the troop/group/service unit, etc. If the business or individual donating funds **is donating less than \$250 and they would like a tax letter**, they **must** also submit their donation through Girl Scouts of Alaska, to then be passed through to the specific troop. The reason for this is Troops/Groups/Service Units do not have 501(c) 3 non-profit corporation status. This means that under IRS regulations, Girl Scout troops, groups, service units, and individual Girl Scouts are NOT tax exempt. However, Girl Scouts of Alaska council does have a 501(c) non-profit. This is why the donation needs to come through GSAK.
