



Position Title: After School Series Program Specialist - Anchorage

Our ASP Program Specialists are responsible for developing and implementing after school programming for girl membership based on the Girl Scout Leadership Experience. This is a part-time position. The Program Specialist will work approximately 12-15 hours a week. The position is located in Anchorage and will run programs in Anchorage schools. Programs run from 3:30pm-5:30pm with the Program Specialist required to be at the school by 3:15pm and leaving when all kids have been picked up around 5:45pm. You will also be required to attend an hour long weekly check-in with your supervisor at the Anchorage Council Office. The pay for this position starts at \$11 per hour.

You Have:

- High school diploma
- Valid Alaska driver's license and clean driving record
- Reliable transportation to get to elementary schools around the Anchorage area
- Ability to pass annual national criminal background check including a check of the National Sex Offender Registry
- Current First Aid and CPR certifications

- Interested and experienced working with youth programming
- Able to demonstrate initiative, make sound decisions, and carry out a multifaceted workload
- Able to show strong attention to detail

- Able to lift and carry at least 35 lbs
