Paying for Camp

Using GEMS

Returning Users - Log into Campbrain with your previously created account. If you don't remember your password, click the "forgot password" link.

New Users - Create a Campbrain account at girlscoutsalska.org/camps

Deposits - Registration includes a \$75 non-refundable deposit per program. Programs that cost \$100 or less include a non-refundable deposit of \$25.

Bring a Buddy - When registering indicate the friend your girl wants to attend camp with. Placement is not guaranteed.

Accommodations - If your girl requires additional assistance or supervision to participate fully or safely in camp, contact us at customercare@girlscoutsalaska.org before registering to ensure we can accommodate her needs.

Cancellations and Refunds - Full payment is due two weeks prior to the start of the camp. A \$25 change fee will be assessed if a camper changes sessions or dates of attendance. Refunds of fees (excluding the deposit) are given if:

- Cancellation is made two weeks in advance
- Camper has moved out of the council
- · Camper has a personal injury/illness confirmed by a physician
- Camper has been exposed to someone with symptoms of or a suspected/confirmed case of communicable disease (refund will include deposit)
- Family emergency

Cancellations must be emailed to customercare@girlscoutsalaska.org. Cancellations made less than two weeks before camp are subject to the full cost of camp. If registering within two weeks of the start of camp, full payment is due at the time of registration.


Using GEMS for Camp



 GEMS earned during the 2023 Fall Product Program and 2024 Girl Scout Cookie Program are eligible to be used for camp.



- 5 GEMS = \$5 discount. GEMS must be spent in increments of 5.
- GEMS (in combination with camperships) can be used to cover up to 2 sessions of camp.
 GEMS cannot be used to cover camp deposits, bus transportation, or camp t-shirts.
- If a camper has available GEMS they will be applied before any request for campership.
 GEMS will be applied to accounts in late April/ early May when the cookie program is finalized.
 Once GEMS are applied you will be emailed an updated invoice.

- Families with product sales or camp delinquencies may be ineligible to use GEMS or apply for camp financial assistance.

Paying for Camp



We know first hand how much youth benefit physically, mentally, and emotionally from a summer camp experience. However we also recognize that while we keep our camps affordable the price may be out of range for some of our Girl Scouts. That's why we offer some different options to help families get their girls to camp.

Tier 1

Full Price. Most closely reflects the true cost of camp.

Tier 2

Partially subsidized for families needing some support to make camp affordable.

Tier 3

Fully subsidized for families needing full support to make camp affordable, sponsored by individual and corporate contributions.

Tiered Pricing FAQs









If I pay a higher/lower tier, will that affect my child's camp experience?

No. Your choice is confidential, and girls' counselors will never know which tier was selected. All girls will get the same high-quality camp experience regardless of the tier you pay. We don't prioritize waitlists, honor buddy requests, or make any other decisions based on which tier was chosen.

Is there pressure to pay one of the higher tiers?

No. The choice is voluntary, and we will never pressure you to pay at a higher level than you are comfortable.

Do I need to provide income verification if I pay at a lower tier?

No verification is required to pay any of the tiers. We also do not require income verification for the campership application.

How does tiered pricing impact camperships?

Camperships are available to any girl who needs assistance. If you are requesting financial aid you should select the lowest tier (Tier 3) rate.

After I register, is it possible to change the tier selected?

Yes, you can change the tier selected up until the point you pay the balance on your account. Regardless of the tier selected, you must pay a \$75 deposit per program when you register. Full payment is due two weeks before the camp session.

If your circumstances or preferences change before paying the balance, you can change the tier by contacting us at customercare@girlscoutsalaska.org. We will not charge a change fee for this change. We do not offer refunds on fees that have already been paid except in the circumstances outlined in our policies.

Welcome to Day Camp



Girl Scout Day Camp is a wonderful way for girls to experience all the

fun of camp and still return home each evening! With guidance from professional staff, day camp is a great place for girls to widen their horizons. Camper groups are typically made up of 15 campers and two counselors and girls may be placed in a multi-age group.



Day camps are held all over Alaska. Camp Singing Hills is in Chugiak, which has a lake, forest, lodge, and trails; and the Juneau Day Camp is located at Sandy Beach in Douglas and has a beach, forest, and trails. Community day camps are also located in communities throughout Southeast, Southcentral, and Southwest Alaska.

Each week of camp will focus on the pillars of Girl Scouts (STEM, outdoors, life skills, and entrepreneurship). Every week of camp also incorporates social-emotional/character development as girls challenge themselves, try new things and work together as a team and with their counselors.




Amazing Animals

Community Day Camps



Girl Scouts of Alaska will be travelling to communities across Alaska to offer weeklong camp programs. During their week at camp, girls will learn outdoor skills, explore nature through environmental education activities, try STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) activities, create arts and crafts, and do a community service project.

Girls may pre-register for camp or register on their first day at camp. Camp locations serve as an initial meeting place. Campers will not spend all day at/inside the meeting location.

Camp runs 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. in Homer, and Kodiak. All other community locations run from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Program Aide (PA)

Camp develops courageous and confident leaders. Under the guidance of our caring counselors, campers in the Program Aide (PA) program develop their leadership skills with hands-on experience working with younger campers. Of course, girls will get to experience everything camp at camp from songs and games to nature hikes.

All day camp locations offer a PA option. Girls must have completed a PA workshop with Girl Scouts of Alaska prior to the first time they attend camp as a PA.

In addition to working on parts of the Program Aide pin, Juneau Program Aides will also work on parts of an outdoor focused Girl Scout badge.

Program Aide (PA) Workshop

Camp Togowoods



Camp Togowoods is located on more than 400 beautiful acres along the shores of Three Mile Lake near Wasilla. It encompasses five ecosystems to explore, and includes a wetlands boardwalk. All Camp Togowoods campers enjoy arts and crafts, nature hikes, environmental education, swimming, canoeing or kayaking, and outdoor cooking. Campers sleep in platform tents (wooden floors, cots, and mosquito netting), bringing the outdoors within reach. Campers have a sense of independence with the security of counselors living in an adjacent tent.

Camper groups are generally made up of 8-12 girls and two counselors. Camper groups attend daily activities together. Special care is taken to ensure that each camper is given challenging opportunities along with basic skill-based instruction.

Traveling to Camp

Girls travel to camp by car and by plane. If your camper is traveling by plane, Girl Scout of Alaska staff will meet her at the airport. Parents are responsible for making travel arrangements. Before making travel arrangements check the parent handbook for specifics on arrival and departure times.

We do not provide bus transportation to Camp Togowoods. If transportation is a barrier for you, contact us at 907-248-2250 or customercare@girlscoutsalaska.org.

Water Programs



Togowoods offers canoeing, kayaking, and recreational row boating. When your camper participates in one of our water programs, she experiences all the fun of our Girl Scout Camp program while building paddling skills during daily program blocks at the waterfront. Campers explore our lake and practice their paddling with our Small Craft Safety-trained staff. As girls gain paddling skills they have the opportunity to participate in progressively challenging adventures.

Wet and Wild campers spend time in or on the water each day as they swim, boat, and play water games.

Paddler's Paradise campers test skills on a half-day kayak trip on Cottonwood Lake and Mud Lake.

River Runners campers experience the ultimate challenge (and thrill) on a half-day river raft trip on Matanuska River with NOVA River Runners. For participant and group safety, NOVA has height and weight requirements for participants. Participants must be between 100 and 265 lbs in weight and between 5ft 2in and 6ft 6in in height. Participants should also be physically fit.

Water Wilderness Programs

Wilderness Adventure Programs



Wilderness trips take courage, confidence, and character to the limit. In small groups, girls quickly learn to count on each other while having fun. Our wilderness trips lay a solid foundation for leadership, teamwork, and self-confidence throughout girls' lives.

All trek programs spend time in remote wilderness areas and at many points on-trail, groups will be more than two hours from professional medical care. Staff are trained in emergency backcountry procedures, carry satellite phones, and at least one staff member is certified in Wilderness First Aid. All programs require a properly fitted backpack, wilderness-rated packable sleeping bag, and hiking boots. Campers should be able to carry a 20-30 lb. backpack and, for canoeing treks, share the weight of carrying an 80-lb. canoe for up to a mile over land. All wilderness campers also experience the fun of our Girl Scout Camp programs. Trips are based out of Camp Togowoods.

Sojourners Grades 4-5

Improve your canoeing and learn how to portage a canoe with a 3-day paddle in the Nancy Lake System.

Challenge yourself on a 6 day canoe trip on the Swan Lakes Canoe System, and a 1/2 day sea kayak trip on Resurrection Bay with Sunny Cove.

Camp develops courageous and confident leaders. Girls of all ages practice decision-making, communication with others, and work on conflict-resolution skills. Our Lead On campers also participate in leadership discovery activities. Throughout a week of hands-on activities, girls will put leadership skills to work. Girls will also get to experience everything at camp from hiking to art to boating and more.

Girls who complete Lead On are eligible to attend to Lead On: Take Action session for free. Girls will further develop their leadership skills with hands-on experience as a leader for younger campers. Lead On: Take Action campers will debrief together as a group and will sleep in tents with other Lead On: Take Action campers.

Lead On meets the requirements for the Counselor in Training (CIT) program. Girls may attend Lead On multiple summers and earn their Counselor in Training (CIT) II pin.
