Health, Wellness & Safety





Camper and staff safety are our top priorities. Safety is at the forefront of every decision we make. Summer camp health and safety protocols are based on current guidance from the State of Alaska, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Girl Scouts USA (GSUSA), and the American Camp Association (ACA).

Nothing is more important than the emotional and physical safety of our campers. Our programs allow campers to take healthy risks in a safe, nurturing environment. Our professional staff receive extensive training and are chosen for their maturity and ability to be a positive role model for girls.

Water Safety

At some of our camps, girls participate in canoeing, kayaking, recreational row boating, and/or swimming. When

participating in these activities, we follow all GSAK and ACA guidelines. At any point when campers are in or on the water, they will be wearing a lifejacket. They will explore our lakes and practice their paddling with our small craft safety-trained staff. When they are swimming they will be supervised by staff including the Waterfront Specialist who is a trained lifeguard.

Wilderness Trips

When groups are traveling off-site to an area that is more than two hours from any professional medical care, we take extra precautions following GSAK and ACA guidelines. The staff leading these groups are trained in emergency backcountry procedures, carry satellite phones, and at least one staff member is certified in Wilderness First Aid.



Girls going into grades 7-12 can get a unique camp experience by being a Program Aide at Singing Hills Day Camp. Working alongside group counselors, Program Aides will get hands-on experience working with younger campers and planning activities.

To Apply

When registering for camp, campers must fill out an application explaining their interest in this program. They will then be able to register for one of the in-person or virtual Program Aide training sessions that need to be completed before they participate at camp. This training will help prepare them for their time at camp and start building their skills.

Program Aides will work on parts of their Prograim Aide pin while gaining skills and developing into confident leaders.

Camp Togowoods (Overnight Camp) 🔫 🛖 🕨





Camp Togowoods is located on more than 400 beautiful acres along the shores of Three Mile Lake near Wasilla. It encompasses five ecosystems to explore, and includes a wetlands boardwalk. All Camp Togowoods campers enjoy arts and crafts, nature hikes, environmental education, swimming, canoeing or kayaking, and outdoor cooking. Campers sleep in platform tents (wooden floors, cots, and mosquito netting), bringing the outdoors within reach. Campers have a sense of independence with the security of counselors living in an adjacent tent.

Campers will make new friends in groups made up of 8-12 girls and two counselors. Camper groups attend daily activities and meals together. Special care is taken to

ensure that each camper has the chance to learn and grow with challenging activities along with basic skill-based instruction.

Traveling to Camp

By Car: On the first day of camp, drop off is from 2:30 to 3:30, and on the last day, pick up is from 4:30 to 5:30. We will email directions to camp a couple of weeks before the session.

By Plane: If your camper is flying to camp, please contact Girl Scouts of Alaska before making travel arrangements. We want to help you pick the best times for your camper's arrival and departure and discuss the necessary pick-up and drop-off arrangements.

For all Day Wilderness Adventure programs, campers will go off-site to practice and refine the skills they have been learning at camp and also get to experience activities like hiking, boating, and arts and crafts while at Camp Togowoods.

Paddlers Paradise August 3-8 Cost: \$800/ \$700/ \$ 600 Grades 6-8

Paddlers Paradise campers test skills on a half-day kayak trip on Cottonwood Lake and Mud Lake. Campers should be comfortable in and on the water already.



River Runners

Grades 9-12

River Runners campers experience the ultimate challenge (and thrill) on a half-day river raft trip on Matanuska River with NOVA River Runners. For participant and group safety, NOVA has height and weight requirements for participants. Participants must be between 100 and 265 lbs in weight and between 5ft 2in and 6ft 6in in height. Participants should also be physically fit, and comfortable in the water.



Overnight Wilderness Adventures



Campers experience Alaska in these thrilling adventure camps. All overnight wilderness programs require a properly fitted backpack, a wilderness-rated packable sleeping bag, and hiking boots. Campers should be able to carry a 20-30 lb backpack, be physically able to share the weight of carrying an 80 lb canoe for up to 1 mile over land, and be comfortable hiking for 3 miles a day.

Voyaging Exploration July 6-11 | Grades 6-8 Cost: \$800/\$700/\$600

Campers will practice and gain confidence in their paddling and camping skills with an overnight canoe adventure in the Nancy Lake system.

Voyaging Quest July 20-25 | Grades 6-8 Cost:\$800/\$700/\$600

Campers will improve their canoeing and learn how to portage a canoe during a threeday, two-night paddle through Nancy Lake's lake system, allowing them to explore more of the area.

Trailblazing Exploration July 20-25 | Grades 6-8 Cost: \$800/\$700/\$600

Campers will go on an overnight backpack trip in Hatcher Pass to learn and practice hiking and setting up a minimally invasive campsite where they will spend the night.

Trailblazing Quest August 3-8 | Grades 6-8 Cost: 800/\$700/\$600

Campers will practice their backpacking skills and camping skills on a 3-day, 2 night trip in Hatcher Pass.

Trailblazing Expedition August 3-8 | Grades 9-12 Cost:\$800/\$700/\$600

Campers will challenge themselves on a 4-day, 3-night backpacking trip through Johnson Pass in the Chugach National Forest. *Campers will hike 8 miles a dav.

Pack n Paddle July 27-August 1 | Grades 6-8 Cost: \$800/\$700/\$600

Campers enjoy canoeing and backpacking in this adventure camp. Canoe through the Nancy Lake's lake system, spend one night camping there, then go to the Hatcher Pass area for backpacking and to spend 1 night.

Paddle on the Coast July 13-18 | Grades 9-12 Cost: \$800/\$700/\$600

Campers will spend a night camping at Millers Landing and get an opportunity to sea kayak on a half-day trip in Resurrection Bay with Sunny Cove.


Build Your Own Camp Adventure June 29-July 2 | Grades 6-12
