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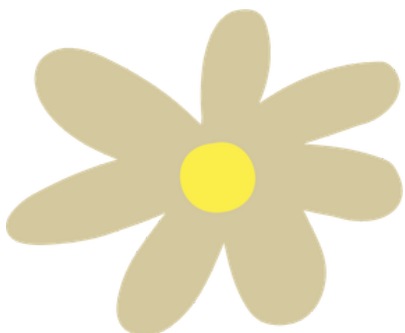

Camp Togowoods and Camp Singing Hills are accredited by the American Camp Association (ACA). We are proud to be Alaska's only accredited camps for girls, meeting standards for health and safety, staffing, and program quality. Camper and staff safety are our top priorities. Safety is at the forefront of every decision we make. Summer camp health and safety protocols are based on current guidance from Girl Scouts of the USA (GSUSA), the American Camp Association (ACA), the State of Alaska, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP).

Nothing is more important than the emotional and physical safety of our campers. Our programs allow campers to take healthy risks in a safe, nurturing environment. Our professional staff receive extensive training and are chosen for their maturity and ability to be a positive role model for girls.

Water Safety

At some of our camps, girls participate in canoeing, kayaking, recreational row boating, paddleboarding, and/or swimming. When participating in these activities, we follow all GSAK and ACA guidelines. At any point when campers are in or on the water, they will wear a lifejacket. They will explore our lakes and practice their paddling with our small craft safety-trained staff. When they are swimming, they will be supervised by staff, including a trained and certified lifeguard.

Wilderness Trips

When groups are traveling off-site to an area that is more than two hours from any professional medical care, we take extra precautions following GSAK and ACA guidelines. The staff leading these groups are trained in emergency backcountry procedures, carry satellite communication devices, and at least one staff member is certified in Wilderness First Aid.

At all our camps, campers will get the chance to enjoy and learn through arts and crafts, environmental education, outdoor survival skills, and STEM activities. Campers will make new friends in their groups of similarly aged campers while participating in daily activities together. Special care is taken to ensure that each camper has the chance to learn and grow with challenging activities focusing on character development with skill-based instruction.

All day and overnight camp groups (other than Build Your Own Adventure) will also earn and receive a Girl Scout badge or leadership pin each week, specific to the Girl Scout level they are going into. The specific badge/pin they will earn is listed with the session descriptions.

5. Pay a portion or full camp fee (see payment schedule).
6. Check for your confirmation email. If you do not receive one, you will not get any other updates. Contact camp@girlscoutsalaska.org for help.

Returning Campers

1. Log in to Campbrain, reset your password if necessary.
2. Select camp week.
3. Pay your \$75 non-refundable deposit to hold your spot. Your deposit will be applied to the camp fee. You will have the option to request a campership, or to redeem Cookie Dough or Camp Vouchers.
4. Pay a portion or full camp fee (see payment schedule).
5. Check for your confirmation email. If you do not receive one, you will not get any other updates. Contact camp@girlscoutsalaska.org for help.

Bring a Buddy

When registering, indicate the friend your girl wants to attend camp with. Placement is considered but not guaranteed. The buddy needs to be of a similar age & signed up for the same sessions. If you do not want siblings in the same tent, DO NOT list them as buddies.

Cookie Dough

Girls can earn and apply Cookie Dough to attend camp through participation in the 2025 Fall Product Program and 2026 Girl Scout Cookie Program. Please note that Cookie Dough cannot be spent to cover the non-refundable deposit or the transportation fee.

To Redeem Cookie Dough for Camp:

1. Have a current Girl Scout membership.
2. Register for your session in Campbrain
3. Check “Use Cookie Dough” box during camp registration.
4. Pay non-refundable deposit of \$75. Cookie Dough will be auto-applied in May. Your balance will show any remaining fees due.

Please be aware that if you are applying for a campership, any Cookie Dough your camper has will be applied first.

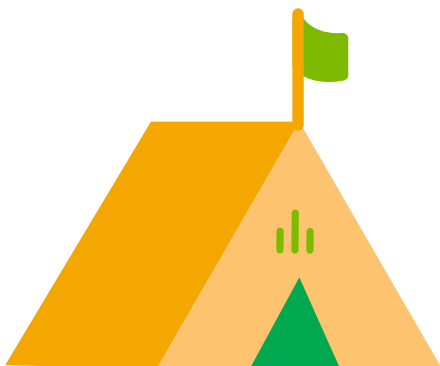
What to Know!

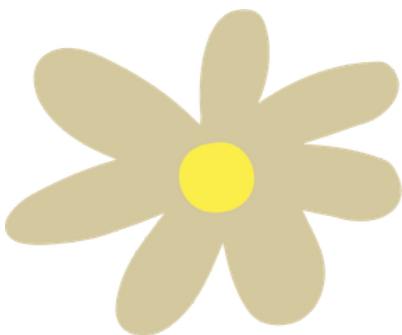

Program Aide (PA) - Grades 7-12

Program Aides will have the opportunity to share their passion for camp with younger campers and to develop their leadership skills. They will learn and practice leading activities for younger campers. Program Aides will participate in and assist with camp activities within their assigned activity group. They will also have time to work on and develop their leadership skills. By the end of the week, Program Aides in 6th-8th grade will have completed all the requirements for the Cadette Leadership Program Aide Award and will receive their pin. This is a prerequisite for earning their Silver Award.

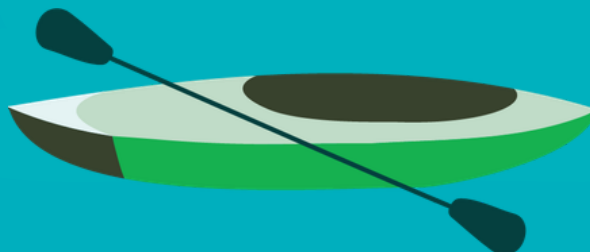
